BIOGRAPHY

James Pewtherer, originally from San Francisco, studied Waldorf education for two years at Emerson College in the UK in the early 70's and has been a Steiner/Waldorf teacher since then.

In 1973, he was a founding teacher at the Hawthorne Valley Waldorf School on a 350-acre farm in New York, and has taught elementary, high school and teacher education courses in both New York and New England.

He has a degree in literature and a training in biodynamic horticulture from University of California, Santa Cruz.

James has served in leadership roles in the Association of Waldorf Schools of North America, was a founding member of the Pedagogical Section Council of North America, is a member of the International Forum for Waldorf/Steiner Education (Hague Circle) and is a First Class Holder in the School for Spiritual Science of the Anthroposophical Society.
